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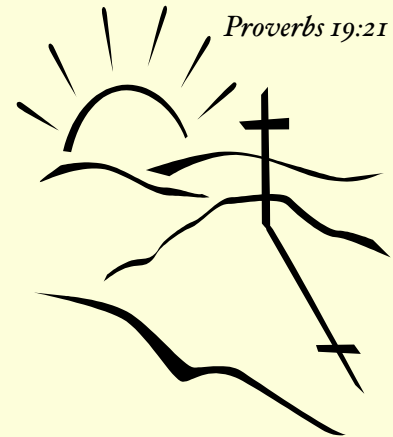

Tough Questions about God and the Bible

Whether you've been in church your whole life or just started going to your very first Bible study, you have questions. Tough questions about God, His Bible, and how it relates to your life here and now.

In an effort to start filling in a few of the knowledge gaps relating to living the Christian life, the ladies of the night group gathered for a night called 'Faith Fillers' to spend time reflecting on areas that have been known to be particularly challenging.

Some questions, like 'What role does the Holy Spirit play in the Trinity?', have straightforward answers in Scripture. Others, like 'When does life actually begin?', are more challenging. The Faith Fillers Q&A panel responded to questions submitted ahead of time by Bible study members and made an effort to give thorough, Scripturally-sound answers. Although many responses were given, the subject matter brought up as many new questions as it answered. *(continued)*

TOUGH QUESTIONS ABOUT GOD AND THE BIBLE CONTINUED

So what should we do when the Bible doesn't give a straight answer to our difficult questions? And what do we do when our personal beliefs do not line up with the Bible?

‘Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls’ (Matthew 11:29)

If you find yourself in either of these situations, here are some ideas for what to do next. First, we should pray, because God promises that ‘if any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach’ (James 1:5). Sometimes a single prayer brings an answer, but more often, these difficult matters require prayer and reflection over time.

Another step in seeking wisdom is to use resources for studying the Bible more deeply. Tools like a concordance, a Bible dictionary, and good commentaries can take you to relevant passages and shift the way you look at them so that God's teaching becomes more apparent. Many of these resources are available online and are free to users.

As you seek independently, it is also wise to look for guidance and encouragement in your community of Believers. Trusted Christian friends, topical books, and especially church and Bible study leaders can be helpful resources in guiding your thinking around challenging topics. Conversations

over time with trusted Christians can sometimes bring clarity or a change of heart about the topic we are struggling with.

Sometimes we come to hard lessons in Scripture – things we do not agree with or believe. Does this mean that if you feel this way, you have to put your faith on hold? We all find at different times that it is difficult to believe that God is good or that God is enough. It can be tempting to retreat, but this is an important time to pursue answers to the questions heavy on your heart. If you think a topic relating to the Christian faith might hold you back from believing, know that your question – or your doubt – is not too much for God to handle. He welcomes our honest misgivings and frustrations and is more than strong enough to bring us peace and understanding. He invites us through Christ, ‘Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls’ (Matthew 11:29). God promises to teach and love us even when we cannot see or accept his Truth, and He will not abandon us in our doubt. When we are faced with doubts, let's pray like the man said to Jesus, ‘I believe; help my unbelief!’ (Mark 9:24).
